EU citizens staying in Poland are eligible for free health service providing they present their European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) along with the Student ID and passport or ID card . EU citizens not having insurance in their country of residence and non-EU citizens may sign an insurance agreement with the Polish National Health Fund (NFZ-Narodowy Fundusz Zdrowia) or with one of private clinics.
