Application Procedure

Basic information

Level of study: Second-cycle (Master's degree)

Mode of study: Full-time Language of study: English

Duration: 2 years

Tuition fee: 4000-4600 EUR/year

Candidates are required to register online on the Internet Registration of Candidates (IRK) platform and pay the application fee:

First round: **early June to mid-July**Documents submission: **late July**

Required documents

The items from the list below are described in-detail BELOW:

- a higher education diploma (MA, BA, engineering degree or equivalent),
- 🚺 a transcript of grades
- a personal questionnaire
- an application for an electronic student card
- proof of payment for the student identity card (ELS)
- a statement of acquaintance with the amount of tuition fees at the University of Warsaw
- legalisation, apostille and/or documentation of the diploma entitling the holder to study at university level in the country of issue
- a document recognised by the University of Warsaw attesting to the holder's knowledge of English (at least B2 level)
- proof of payment of the application fee
- 🚺 a photocopy of the visa or other document legalising the stay in Poland
- authorisation to submit documents if the other person submits the candidate's documents.

^{*} Level of skills for candidates that don't have certificate honoured by the University of Warsaw (at least B2 level) will be checked in online interview on Google Meet.

Visas & Legalisation of stay in Poland

Before coming to Poland, you should check whether you need to apply for a Polish student visa in your home country. Detailed information on how to apply and what type of visa you need, as well as other useful information on legalising your stay in Poland, can be found on the UW Welcome Point:

Important during your stay in Poland

- PESEL number
- Bank account
- Healthcare
- Registration of address
- Telecommunications
- Trusted profile (profil zaufany) etc.

Health insurance is **mandatory for all students** for the whole duration of their stay in Poland. Every student coming to the University of Warsaw for short-term studies will be asked to present proof of health insurance upon arrival.

We advise to purchase third party liability insurance and accident insurance in their home countries.

EU citizens staying in Poland are eligible for free health service providing they present their **European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)** along with the **Student ID** and **passportor ID card**.

EU citizens not having insurance in their country of residence and non-EU citizens may sign an insurance agreement with **the Polish National Health Fund** (NFZ-Narodowy Fundusz Zdrowia) or with one of private clinics.

Specialisation/ Major

We offer two specialisations within the International Business Program:

Faculty Campus



The Służew Campus is located in the Mokotów district, close to the Służew metro station, city buses and trams, which provide excellent transport connections (20 minutes by public transport to the centre of Warsaw and 10 minutes to Warsaw Frederic Chopin Airport). The Faculty of Management is housed in modern buildings with well-equipped lecture halls, classrooms and computer rooms. In addition to the Faculty's modern infrastructure, you can find peace and quiet in the Faculty's library or in the surrounding gardens.

UW Main Campus



The University's main campus is located in the heart of Warsaw on Krakowskie Przedmieście Street and houses, among other things, the University Administration, the International Relations Office and the Welcome Point.

UW Library

BUW (Biblioteka Uniwersytetu Warszawskiego) is the main University of Warsaw Library. It is situated not far from the city centre – in Powiśle district in the vicinity of the Old Town and Vistula river. It is only 10 minutes walking distance from the main Campus of the University in Krakowskie Przedmieście.

Apart from the large collection of books, journals and other study and research materials, you will be able to access computers, printers and copy machines there. Don't forget to visit the rooftop garden to relax and enjoy a panoramic view of the city after you are done studying.
